Igniting the concept of health promotion, inspiring higher education, and shaping healthier campuses in ASEAN and beyond.


Mission

1.1 AUN-HPN past activities 2023 - 2024

1.1.1 AUN-HPN Presentation at ASAIHL International Conference 2023

On December 7, 2023, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Thunwadee Suksaroj, on behalf of the AUN-HPN Secretariat, participated in the ASAIHL International Conference 2023. Held at the University of Science and Technology of Hanoi in Vietnam, the conference theme was "International Cooperation Toward Excellence in Training and Research."

Representing both the AUN-HPN Secretariat and the ASAIHL Thailand candidate, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Thunwadee presented an academic paper titled "Building a Health Promotion Exemplar: The Development of an International University Network Model through the AUN Healthy University Framework." This presentation provided an overview of the ASEAN University Network – Health Promotion Network (AUN-HPN) and its activities, with the goal of strengthening health promotion systems within these institutions at both the national and ASEAN regional levels.






1.1.2 The 2nd Thai Healthy University Network Conference



The 2nd Thai Healthy University Network Conference, organized by the AUN-HPN Secretariat and TUN-HPN, took place on March 21–22, 2024, under the theme "Building a Culture of Health Promotion: Fostering Mental Health Awareness and Support on Campus." The conference featured key speakers, including leaders from TUN-HPN and the Thai Health Promotion Foundation. It provided a platform for Thai universities to exchange experiences in mental health care and advance health promotion initiatives. The event also included the 10th TUN-HPN Committee Meeting, where the new chairperson was selected. Funded by ThaiHealth, the conference emphasized the implementation of the AUN Healthy University Framework (HUF) to promote sustainability in health across Thai universities.



The Healthy University Rating System (HURS) 2023, launched from August 15 to November 16, 2023, saw participation from 21 ASEAN leading universities. After data verification, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia and Universitas Indonesia were likely to receive the 5-star+ rating. To finalize scores and eligibility, site visits were proposed to assess alignment with HURS criteria, promote knowledge exchange, and highlight best practices. The HURS development committee aimed to use these visits to enhance data compilation practices and improve monitoring and evaluation across the network.


















HURS Workshop 2024 for Data Entry

1st round: Improving Healthy University Implementation Based on Healthy University Rating System (HURS)

On July 8, 2024, the AUN-HPN Secretariat hosted the first HURS Workshop 2024, themed "Improving Healthy University Implementation Based on HURS." Experts from top universities such as Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia, Universitas Indonesia, and De La Salle University shared best practices in health promotion. The workshop, attended by 160 delegates from 56 universities in ASEAN and Japan, offered hands-on training in the HURS system and facilitated discussions on advancing health initiatives. The event concluded with collaborative strategies for enhancing health promotion, fostering strong networking and partnerships for future projects, and reinforcing the commitment of ASEAN universities to improve health and well-being.



HURS Workshop 2024 for Data Entry

2nd round: The Evaluation of Healthy University Rating System (HURS)

On September 16, 2024, the AUN-HPN Secretariat hosted the second round of HURS Workshop 2024 in Bangkok, focusing on the evaluation of the Healthy University Rating System (HURS). The workshop featured updates to the HURS Version 2024, including revised criteria and data submission processes. Participants tested the University Data Entry system and discussed the HURS framework, which evaluates universities across 22 health promotion areas. The HURS evaluation period for 2024 runs from August 16 to November 15, with universities invited to register for the evaluation cycle.

1.1.4 HURS Workshop 2024



On November 26, 2024, the AUN-HPN Secretariat, hosted a HURS Workshop for Reviewers. The workshop aimed to familiarize reviewers with the revised HURS assessment criteria and guide effective use of the HURS system. Attended by representatives from 11 AUN-HPN universities, the session featured key speakers, including Dr. Thunwadee Suksaroj and Prof. Chartchalerm Isarankura-Na-Ayudhya. The event covered updates to the HURS Version 2024, which evaluates health promotion activities under the Healthy University Framework. This year, 39 ASEAN universities are participating in the HURS assessment.



Thai University Network for Health Promotion Network (TUN-HPN) was established in 2021, comprising representatives from six leading Thai universities:

- Chulalongkorn University (Central Region)
- Chiang Mai University (Northern Region)
- Burapha University (Eastern Region)
- Prince of Songkla University (Southern Region)
- Khon Kaen University (Northeastern Region)
- Mahidol University (AUN-HPN Secretariat)



Each university is responsible for promoting health policies, striving to become a "Healthy University," fostering collaborative research, and expanding the network nationwide. All universities use **HUF** as a guideline on how to be a Healthy University and **HURS** as a tool to monitor their progress.

Leadership Rotation:

Initially, the chairmanship of the Thai University Network for Health Promotion Network rotated annually. However, the term was later extended to two years to strengthen and enhance operational efficiency. The TUN-HPN chairmanship since the network's establishment are as follows:

- 2021-2023: Mahidol University
- 2023-2025: Chulalongkorn University
- 2025-2027 (Current): Chiang Mai University


