

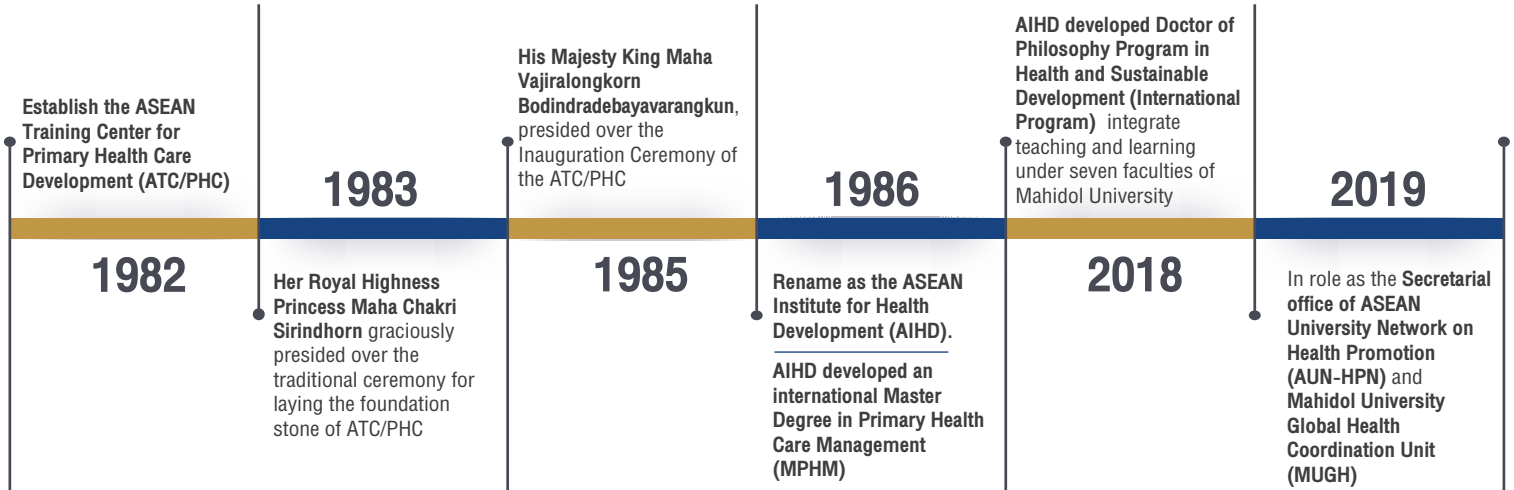

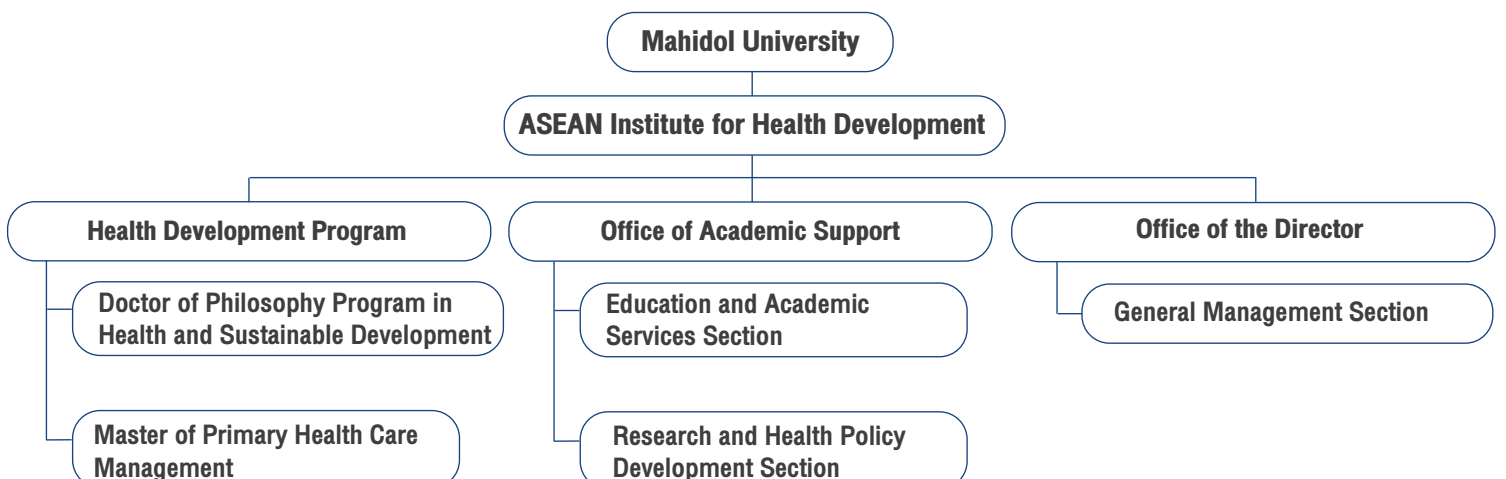

Vision

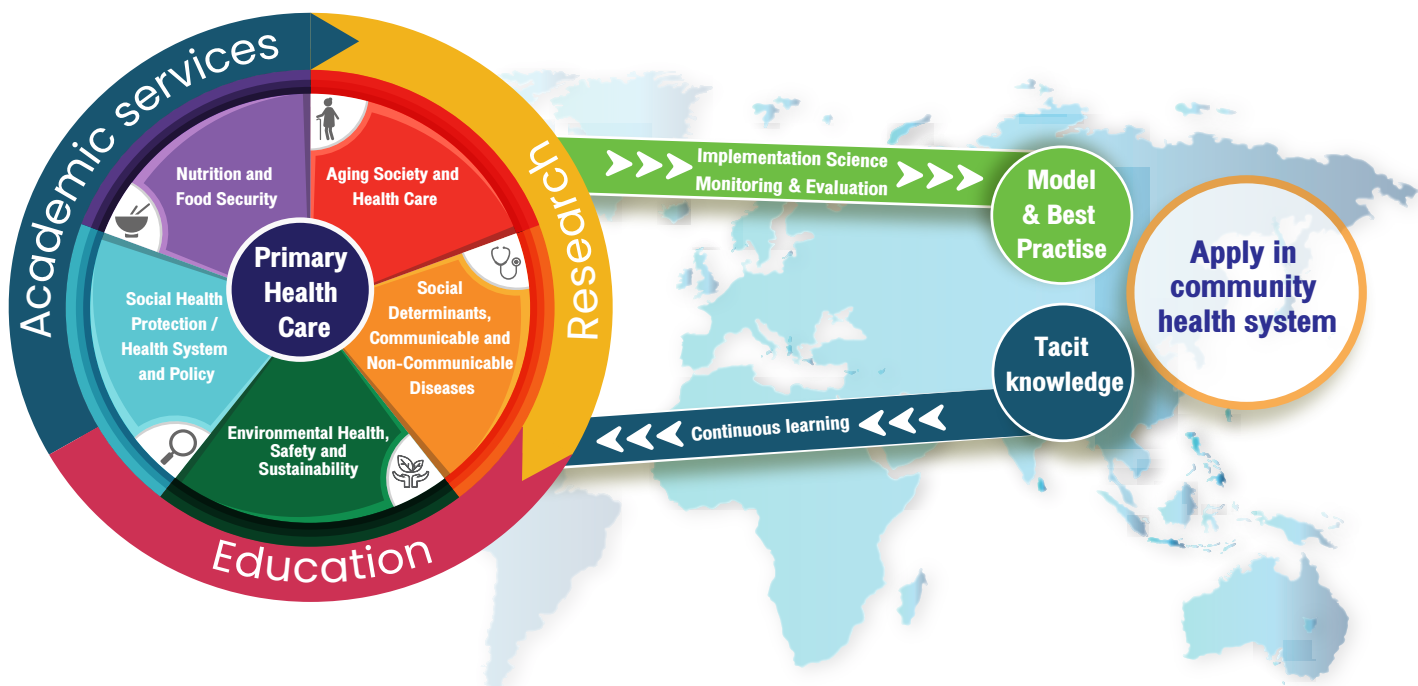
We aim to provide proactive support system for seamless research endeavors in primary healthcare on global health, health policy and development to AIHD and our collaborators.

Doctor of Philosophy in Health and Sustainable Development

HIGHLIGHT TRAINING COURSE

Mini Master in Health Training Program

ASEAN Institute for Health Development (AIHD), in collaboration with the Thai Association of Preventive Medicine, is organizing a training program for high-level management in public health (Mini Master of Management in Health: Mini MM). The aim is to enhance the capabilities of healthcare professionals, including physicians, nurses, academics, and related personnel at the local, district, provincial, and national levels. The objective is to develop leadership qualities and managerial skills in the field of modern public health, enabling participants to perform managerial duties with confidence and effectiveness.

Period of the program: The program will be scheduled every June and December.

Thailand Community-Based Health System

This two-weeks summer program intends to provide first hand experience for international students to understand the world recognized community-based health system in Thailand. All participants will learn about Thailand's health system, learn lessons from Thailand's primary health care and universal health coverage from the national level to grassroots level. All participants will experience community assessment to indicate community health needs.

Target audiences:

Undergrad or post grad students who are interested in community health, and Thailand health system.

Period of the program:

The program will be scheduled every May to July each year.

Social and Health Development in Thailand

The Social and Health Development in Thailand International Training is a targeted program aimed at enhancing capacity building and fostering the exchange of valuable experiences within the realm of social and health development. Tailored for professionals in healthcare, public health, and social services, this training initiative seeks to create a collaborative platform for participants to strengthen their skills, share insights, and contribute to the ongoing progress of social and health development in Thailand.

Period of the program: The program will be scheduled every August each year.

Outstanding Primary Health Care Leader Program

Primary Health Care and health system resilience Module:

To provide knowledge of primary health care and health system resilience and to enhance skill sets for conducting situation analysis, future studies, problem identification, problem prioritization, synthesizing feasibility of interventions, and sustaining health care system during public health emergencies

Risk analysis and Health system Module:

To provide knowledge of global health issues, risk analysis, global health system and risk analysis, and to enhance skill sets for risk assessments, health hazard identification, and risk management for both national and international aspects

Plan Formulation Module:

To equip skill sets for plan formulation, including strategic plan, action plan and budget plan.

Implementation research: Translating science to practice Module:

To enhance knowledge of implementation research and equip skill sets for conducting implementation research

ASEAN University Network - Health Promotion Network (AUN-HPN)

AIHD was assigned by Mahidol University Council to take the responsibility as AUN-HPN Secretariate office since 2019. AUN-HPN was established as thematic network of AUN, and has been serving as regional network of people and universities working towards a better and healthier society.

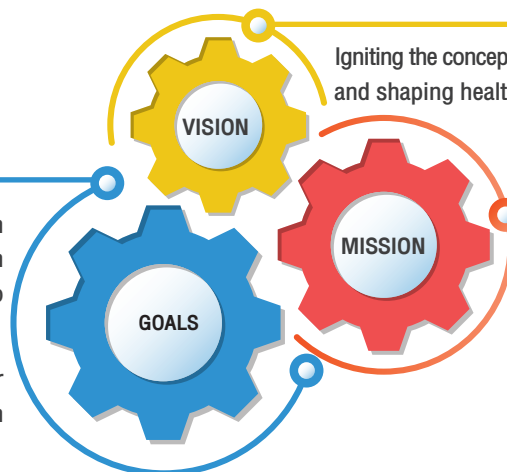

AUN-HPN VISION, MISSION AND GOAL



Igniting the concept of health promotion, inspiring higher education, and shaping healthier campuses in ASEAN and beyond.

- To promote the roles of universities in health promotion, particularly on action-oriented policy that related to community and public health.
- To proactively promote platforms for knowledge sharing in the area of health promotion.
- To make recommendations for further development of the collaboration framework on interdisciplinary health promotion in the East Asian region.

- To serve as a platform for ASEAN higher education institutions for collaboration among themselves and with other key stakeholders for the purpose of “Health Promotion” in the ASEAN region.
- To share knowledge, skills, and resources among the network members to build capacity for health promotion and develop innovative solutions to common health challenges in the region.

AUN-HPN INNOVATION

Healthy University Framework (HUF)

In 2017, HUF was published being the reference guide for universities in health promotion at university level. The HUF describes health promotion initiatives in ASEAN universities, principal determinants of a healthy university, implementation of a healthy university framework, and mechanisms for assessment-monitoring-evaluation of a healthy university. The 22 areas of HUF are divided into 3 areas: system and infrastructure, zero tolerance and health promotion.

Healthy University Rating Scale (HURS)

AUN-HPN has developed a tool aiming to monitor the implementation of the university’s process. The tool, which is called “the Healthy University Rating Scale”, or “HURS”, contains 42 assessment items based on 22 areas of the Healthy University Framework (HUF). HURS is an accessible online tool that a university can score their own progress based on the level of implementation in all 22 areas, with a total score of 1,000. The overall composite score can be used to calibrate or compare with the preset rating criteria classified into 1 – 5 stars, similar to the hotel star-rating system. Participating universities can use the scores to evaluate health promotion progress as well as to compare the healthy university status among different faculties within the institution or with other universities.

AUN-HPN are a collaborative network consisting of 40 universities from ASEAN+3. Together, our network aim to ignite the concept of health promotion, inspire higher education, and shape healthier campuses in ASEAN and beyond



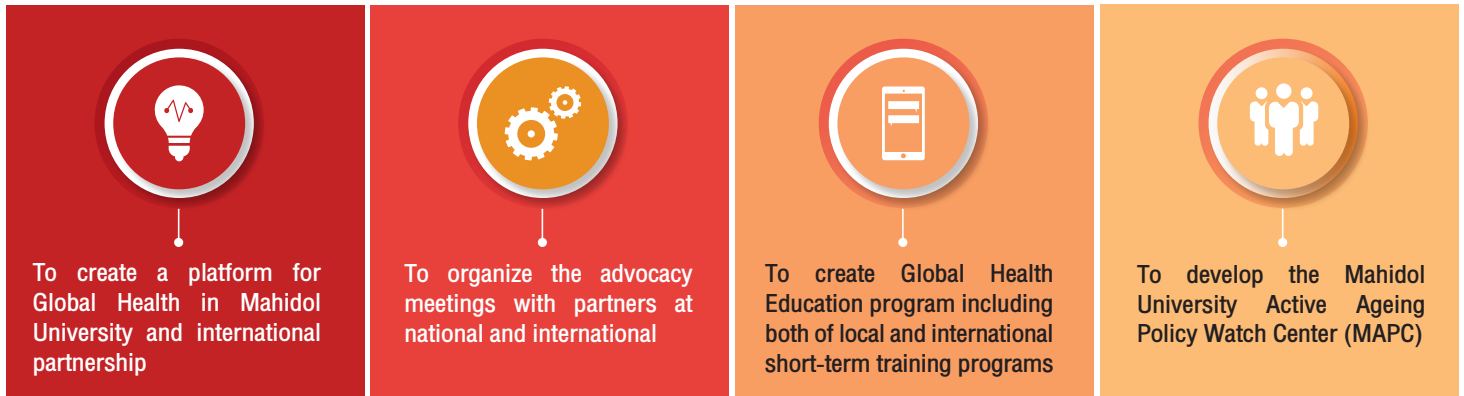
Mahidol University Global Health Coordination Center (MUGH)

Journal of Public Health and Development (J Public Hlth Dev) is a double blinded peer-reviewed journal published by ASEAN Institute for Health Development (AIHD), Mahidol University, Thailand. The journal is dedicated to publish excellent research in Public Health and related fields. The journal publishes three issues per year (January-April, May-August, and September-December). The journal has been indexed in the ASEAN Citation index since 2015, Thai-Journal Citation Index (Tier 1) since 2012 and Scopus index since 2020.

TYPES OF ARTICLES

Original Articles

The original articles demonstrate the novel and scientific knowledge that has not been published elsewhere. These articles feature prominent, new and compelling findings that are impactful to other public health professionals and related field researchers.

Review Articles

The journal welcomes manuscripts for comprehensive review and analysis on the specific related topics, for example, systematic review, meta-analysis, and integrative review.

Short Reports

Short reports are similar to original research in that, they follow the same objectivity, format and guidelines, but are designed for small-scale research or research that is in early stages of development.

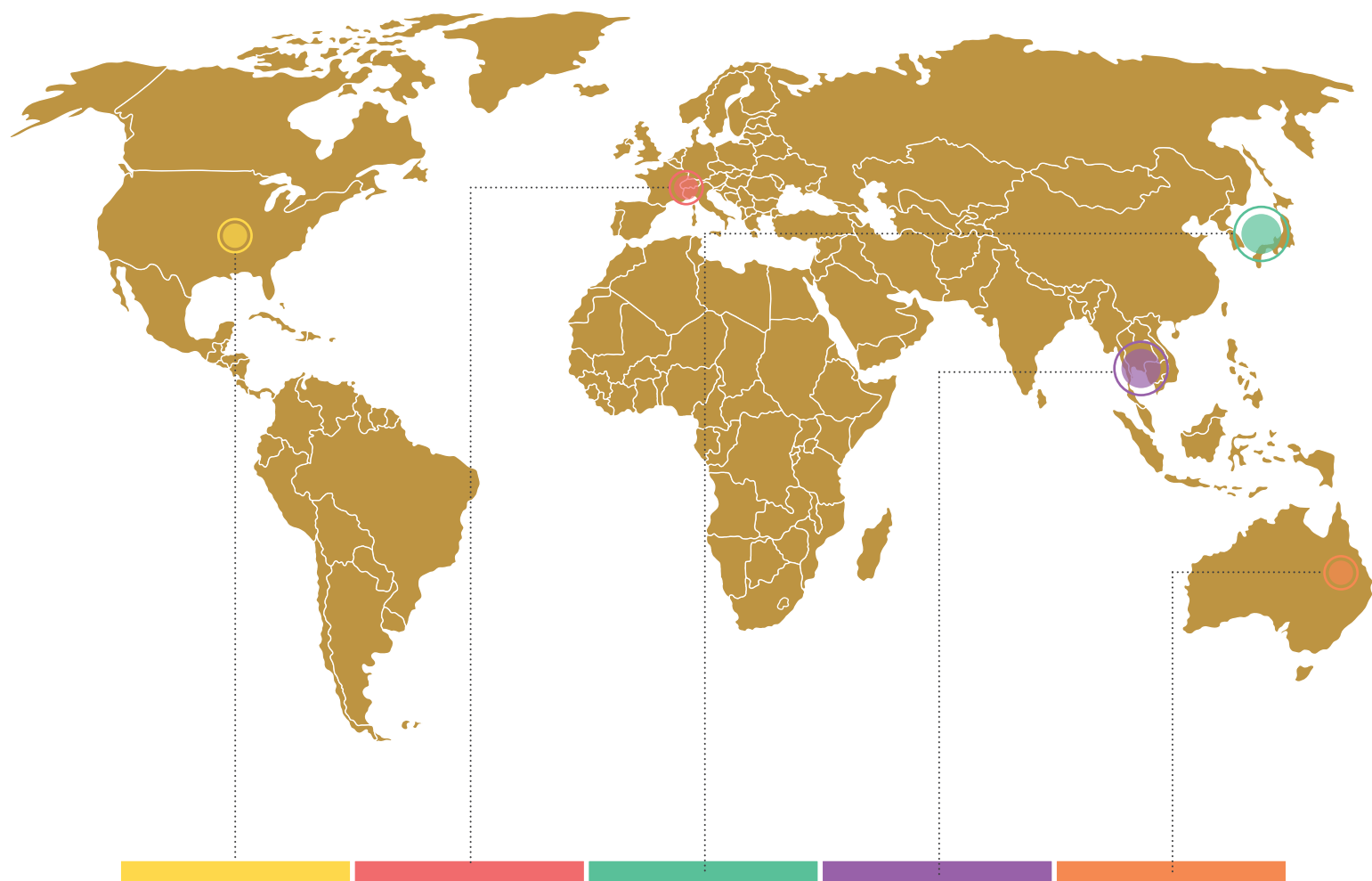
